

Employer Notification to Employees of the Availability of Unemployment Compensation

Department of Employment, Training, and Rehabilitation (DETR) Employment Security Division (ESD)

Nevada Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits are available to workers who are unemployed and who meet the requirements of state UI eligibility laws. You may file a UI claim in the first week that employment stops or work hours are reduced.

To file a claim, use the online Unemployment Insurance Claim Filing System (UInV) at ui.nv.gov. The telephone claim center is available only if you are not able to file online. Staff assisted filing is available, but you may experience excessive wait times due to the current high volume.

You will need to provide the state UI agency with the following information in order for the state to process your claim:

1. Your full legal name;
2. Your Social Security Number;
3. Your authorization to work (if you are not a US Citizen or resident);
4. Your dates of employment and the name of your employer(s).

Note: Employers often use a corporate name or payroll service. Use your pay stubs or W-2 for reference to correctly identify your employer(s) when filing a claim.
